

ALEXANDER HILDEBRAND MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

As a continuing memorial to Alexander Hildebrand, the San Joaquin Farm Bureau has established the Alexander Hildebrand Scholarship Fund with the purpose of providing aid to students who wish to pursue careers in the agricultural sciences and technology. One \$2,000.00 scholarship will be awarded annually.

With the active guidance and participation of the Hildebrand Family, the SJFB Foundation for Agricultural Education, a non-profit educational organization, administers the scholarship.

♦ Who is eligible?

Any student entering or attending an accredited four-year college, university, or graduate program, and pursuing a career in a scientific or technical field that will be used to benefit agriculture (for example engineering, soil or plant sciences, irrigation science/technology, etc.) Students entering a junior college are not eligible for this scholarship.

♦ How are recipients selected?

The following will be given consideration when selecting a recipient. However, the criteria are considered cumulatively and should not be regarded as individual requirements. A) Demonstrated qualities: career goals, scholastic achievement, determination to succeed, leadership, desire to obtain a higher education in science and technology, commitment to agriculture. B) Difficulty and achievement level of academic courses. C) College entrance scores.

♦ Distribution of Funds

The recipient must submit official proof of registration showing the student's full-time enrollment before funds will be disbursed. The student must also have a declared major in agriculture or a related field. This documentation must be sent directly from the recipient's college to the SJFB Foundation for Agricultural Education office.

A scholarship check will be sent directly to the recipient's college, which may credit the recipient's account for tuition, books, laboratory fees, or other academic costs.

Recipients will be presented a certificate recognizing the award at the SJFB's 107th Annual Meeting on a date and time to be determined.

- ♦ Three current letters of recommendation must accompany the application.
- ♦ Official high school, junior college, or college transcripts *must be included with each application.*
- ♦ Where applicable, documentation of SAT and/or ACT scores must be attached.
- ♦ Applications submitted without ALL of the request documentation will not be considered in the selection process
- ♦ *Do not enclose or attach any documents other than the required attachments.*
