

THE BRIAN AND VICKI LAGORIO MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Application for the year 2024

Submission Deadline: Friday, March 29, 2024, by 4 pm.

The Brian and Vicki Lagorio Memorial Scholarship was created to commemorate the lives of Brian and Vicki, who passed away in July 2022 and December 2021, respectively.

Brian and Vicki were very connected to nature and agriculture. Brian grew up farming walnuts and dedicated his life to pursuing his passions. He grew up working on the family farm and developed a strong connection to the land and the cycles of nature. Vicki, who was originally from the city, fell in love with the country lifestyle and the beauty of nature after meeting Brian. They both shared a deep love for the outdoors and the natural world. Together, they built a life centered around their passion for the outdoors and agriculture and inspired others to do the same. They were always looking to explore the natural world and share their love for it with others. Their love and passion for the outdoors will always be remembered.

Awarding the scholarship is contingent on acceptance and enrollment in a two- or four-year college and a complete application, including an essay demonstrating the applicant's passion for agriculture. Additionally, it's expected that the scholarship recipients will bring awareness to mental health and cancer, two causes that took Brian and Vicki's lives. The scholarship is a grant, and recipients are encouraged to use their education and future careers to give back to their communities and raise awareness for these important causes.

Under the guidance and participation of the Lagorio family, the Brian and Vicki Lagorio Memorial Scholarship is administered by the SJFB Foundation for Agricultural Education, a non-profit educational organization. Each year the family will graciously give a \$1,000 scholarship to the deserving candidate.

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Eligibility Requirements

- Applicants must be entering or attending an accredited junior college or four-year university in California with a majority of their study in agriculture.

Application Requirements

- Application and supporting documentation must be postmarked or physically delivered to the San Joaquin Farm Bureau Federation Office no later than Friday, March 29, 2024, by 4 pm.

- One letter of recommendation must accompany the application.
- A one-page essay must accompany the application.
- Official (certified) transcripts must accompany the application.
- Print or type legibly.
- Applications submitted without ALL requested documents will not be considered for selection.
- Do not include any material other than the materials that have been requested.

Selection Criteria

- Demonstrated desire and commitment to pursue a career in the agricultural industry.
- Demonstrated need for financial assistance to fulfill educational goals.

Distribution of Funds

- Recipients will be presented with a certificate recognizing the award at the SJFB's 109th Annual Meeting held on a date to be determined. Attendance is mandatory.
- Upon receipt of a certified document reflecting the recipient's enrollment as a full-time student in a junior college or four-year university, the scholarship check will be sent to the recipient's college, which can be used for tuition, books, or other academic costs.
- Failure to enroll in a junior college or university in the fall of 2023 will result in forfeiture of the award. Unless special consideration has been made by the SJFB Foundation and Wunsch Family.
